The Religion & Spirituality Division, with around 200 members, is one of thirteen professional divisions within the AAIDD, which has approximately 6000 total members. Religion & Spirituality Division members include chaplains, clergy, religious educators, coordinators of ministries with people with disabilities, residential ministries, and staff from a variety of disciplines and settings who share a common commitment to the role of faith and spirituality in services with people with developmental disabilities.
